Dear Parents/Carers

We have been delighted to have all the children back in school and settled for just over a week. They continue to show us their resilience, collaboration with each other and are all working really hard.

We are working hard to mitigate risks by keeping our children in class bubbles and we thank everyone who continues to help us stay as safe as possible.

### **Illness In Children**

We are doing our utmost in school to ensure that any positive contact is minimised as much as possible. We must remain incredibly vigilant, to reduce the risks of further "class-bubble" closures. As I am sure we all agree that we want the children in school for as much "face to face" learning as possible. We certainly do need your support to achieve this, so we please ask that you book a Covid test for your child if they are unwell with any of the main Covid-19 symptoms or any listed in the attached Covid-19 table.

We know that with some of the symptoms it is difficult to determine if the individual has Covid or not and that is why it is better to "err on the side of caution" and book a test. Please also be advised that if you book a test, you need to advise school and the child will not able to attend school until you have been made aware of the outcome of the test.

We are certainly aware of the inconvenience this all causes. But if we all work together we can hopefully minimise any further disruptions to the children's learning.

### Staggered start and finish times - Reminder

Please ensure you adhere to the timings for the start and end of the day so we can keep each bubble as separate as possible and maintain social distancing as this remains a priority at this time. Once you have dropped off or collected your children, please leave the school site promptly. Thank you for continuing to work with us on this.

May we also remind parents/carers you are requested to wear a <u>face mask</u> when on the school site, unless you are exempt to do so.

#### **Parent consultations:**

#### Netball Lessons – (last academic year – 2019/20)

Some of our children took part in netball lessons with Rachael, the netball coach, in the spring term 2020. Unfortunately, due to Covid 19, Rachael was unable to provide sessions for week commencing 23 March 2020 and 30 March 2020. We were hopeful of recommencing netball lessons this academic year and rolling on those two sessions. Unfortunately, this has not been possible as yet. We will be reviewing our situation next term (summer term 2021) and if it is possible for us to offer netball sessions, we will advise parents of that decision.

Please contact the school office by <u>**Tuesday 23 March 2021**</u> if you would like a refund now (£3.00 x 2 sessions = £6.00). If we do not hear from you by that date, we will presume you wish the money to remain on the system in the hope that netball lessons will recommence next term. If however, lessons do not recommence, we will contact the netball coach and ask that refunds are made by the end of this academic year.

### Year 6 Day Trips to Kingswood Activity Centre

Unfortunately, the year 6 residential trip to Kingswood was cancelled due to covid-19. With the future planned lifting of restrictions, we have decided to book a day trip for each year 6 class to attend Kingswood Centre to experience the variety of activities and tasks. This will be a full extended day of activities and a wonderful opportunity for the children. During the day trip, we will ensure that all covid-19 guidelines are adhered to. Children will remain in their class bubbles both on the coach and at the centre. The dates of the trips are as follows:

#### Monday 17 May 2021 Monday 24 May 2021 Monday 7 June 2021

We will confirm in due course which class will be attending the centre on which day in line with government guidelines.

The cost of this trip is  $\pounds 60$  per day, which is higher than our usual day trips, due to the wide range of activities available to the children at the centre, along with a contribution towards the cost of the covid-19 compliant coaches and the need to keep children in their class bubbles.

If your child was attending the residential trip, you will have been refunded your payment, except for this amount ( $\pounds 60$ ) which will remain on your ParentPay.

However, if your child was not attending the residential trip, we are asking for an amount of £60 per child payable via ParentPay under the heading '**Kingswood Day Trip 2021 – Year** 6'. We will be sending out a letter after Easter with further details. If your child is eligible for pupil premium funding, you will receive a separate letter in due course.

### Lateral Flow Testing

A reminder that a few weeks ago the <u>Department of Health and Social Care announced</u> that households with primary school, secondary school and college age children, including childcare and support bubbles, can test themselves twice every week at home as schools return. Please be aware that lateral flow tests are only to be used if you do not have Covid symptoms. If you have Covid symptoms, then you will need to have a PCR test at a local testing centre.

# Elections- 6<sup>th</sup> May 2021

Much to our absolute surprise, the elections office have contacted us to let us know that they are going ahead with their plans to use the school location as a polling station on Thursday  $6^{th}$  May.

We are now in discussion with the elections office and we have proposed our training room (building located between the two schools) as the venue to be used for polling, as we do not want to close the schools and disrupt learning further.

As a Local Authority Community maintained school, this is not our decision and we would have hoped, as do the DFE that schools were not used for polling purposes at all, but unfortunately this is not the case.

As mentioned, we will work with the elections office, so the proposed training room venue can be used safely for polling purposes. Whilst ensuring the health and safety of all pupils, staff and adults on site too.

More information will follow, but we are working hard to ensure that the school will remain open as usual on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> May 2021.
