<u>School Absences During Term Time, including 'lates' and 'early collection'</u> <u>from school</u>

Although we are aware that it is sometimes unavoidable for appointments to be made during the school day, e.g. hospital appointments etc., we would request that, where possible, any **non-urgent appointments, e.g. dental check ups or non-urgent medical appointments etc.** are made outside of school hours. If you do need to collect your child for an appointment early, please ensure you have sent in a note to your child's class teacher in advance.

We will continue to monitor children's attendance in school and emphasize the importance of your child remaining in school for the whole of the school day, until 3.35 pm.

School Absence - A reminder also that if your child is absent from school due to illness, we ask that you telephone the school office on the first day of their absence, before 9.30 am, so that our safeguarding records are up to date.

Late Arrivals – we have a number of children who are regularly coming into school late. Children may come into school from 8.45 am but they should be in their classroom for 8.55 am, ready for registration. This is an important part of the day when the teacher will be taking the register, passing on messages and introducing the first lesson.

A reminder that <u>'Exceptional Circumstances Forms'</u> are available from the school office and must be completed and returned to school, two weeks prior to the requested absence All forms are to be sent to Mrs Silverwood. <u>Please note that any holiday taken during term</u> <u>time will be recorded as unauthorised.</u>
