BOLDMERE INFANT AND NURSERY SCHOOL

Boldmere Infant School's Nursery is state funded and managed by The Federation of Boldmere Schools' governing body. As such, it follows academic terms dates as laid out by Birmingham Authority and Boldmere Infant school.

Nursery is staffed by one teacher, two part-time teaching assistants and two lunchtime play leaders. We also have an Early Year Lead who oversees our Nursery provision.

Boldmere Nursery provides part-time (15 hour) and full time (30 hour) places for up to 26 children (full time equivalent).

Part-time places are allocated for either 5 mornings or 5 afternoons each week (3 hour sessions) from 8.30-11.30 or 12.30-3.30. Parents are asked to express a morning/afternoon preference and we will endeavour to accommodate requests
Full time sessions are 8.30 to 3.30 and include lunchtime provision.

Admissions Criteria

Places are offered according to the Governor Admissions policy. Where we are over subscribed, places will be offered using the following criteria:

- Children currently in Nursery (rising 3s)
- Looked after or previously looked after children
- Siblings (Boldmere Infant and Junior schools)
- Distance from school
- Full time places are offered where eligibility criteria is met. In such cases, a weekly charge for wrap around care is required, as part of the contract between school and parents.

***Please note;** Children attending our nursery do not automatically receive a place in our Infant school. Parents must apply for a Reception place in the same way as those who are not attending our Nursery.

At the beginning of the academic year, children will be welcomed into the Nursery in small groups. This supports children to feel secure, happy and settled in their new setting.
