



Geography



Our Geography curriculum aims to deliver a curriculum which is accessible to all and that will maximise the development of every child's ability and academic achievement in the area of Geography, giving them a curiosity and fascination about the world we live in and its people. We aim to:

- Increase and develop their geographical skills, concepts, knowledge and attitudes.
 - Increase their understanding of locational knowledge.
- Develop and use their skills in enquiry, comparing, locating and describing.
- Develop their interest in the world and the diversity in places and people.
- Develop an interest in enquiring and interpreting using a range of sources.

Intent

Inspiration: For our children to be inspired to use geographical skills in their future lives to understand who they are, their heritage and what makes our world unique.

Aspiration: For our children to understand that everyone needs to take responsibility for our planet and have a sense of respect for our world and the people in it.

Inclusion: For all of our children to have a love of Geography, giving them skills to use for their futures.

Implementation

What we cover?

- Teachers are supported by a clear and comprehensive sequenced scheme of work (connected geography) that offers ideas and resources in line with the National Curriculum.
- Teaching and learning progresses across all key stages within the strands of Geography, including working locational knowledge, place knowledge, human and physical geography and geographical skills and fieldwork.

How is it covered?

- Teaching builds and reviews previous learning, before new learning is taught and extended.
- Children access resources to acquire learning through geographical equipment, digital technology, practical experiences, rich vocabulary and maps.
 - Skills are developed throughout the year groups and are covered three times a year.
- The local geographical area is fully utilised to achieve desired outcomes by making learning pertinent to our children.

Impact

- The large majority of children will achieve age related expectations in geography.
- Children will begin to understand their wider world and the implications that we as citizens have on it.
- Children will be fluent in complex geographical enquires, including the ability to apply questioning and use effective analytical techniques.
 - Children to have a knowledge and understanding about their local area.
- Children to understand current and contemporary issues in the society and environment.
