Key achievements to date: Review of 2024-2025

1) **Intent-** To increase the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.

Implementation- Albion Foundation coach employed for 4 hours each day to target those children who are less physically active as well as providing a broader range of activities and opportunities at lunchtime. Albion to work with pupils each afternoon to engage with pupils who do not access sport at lunchtime or during after-school clubs. Increase the use of the daily mile tracker across school. Pupils from year 4 – 6 will take part in swimming sessions by qualified swim coaches.

Impact- Albion Foundation coach worked in school for 3 full days per week – this targeted pupils who did not access after school clubs. 87% of school accessed either a lunch or after-school club this academic year. 81% of pupil premium pupils accessed either a lunch or after-school club this academic year. Number of pupils accessing the daily mile increased through school tracking system as well as additional resources such as skip 2 b fit and DD mix daily dance. Pupils from years 4-6 took part in swimming sessions by qualified coaches. By the end of year 6, 59% of pupils could swim at least 25 metres. Reception pupils were offered an after school club in summer term to help with transition into year 1.

NEXT steps – Albion Foundation coach employed to continue to work with children who are less physically active as well as providing a broader range of activities and opportunities at lunchtime. Albion Foundation to work with selected pupils in small intervention groups to increase number of pupils that are physically active. Albion to work with pupils each afternoon to engage with pupils who do not access sport at lunchtime or during after-school clubs. Increase the use of the daily mile tracker across school by continuing the daily mile tracking system. Pupils from year 4 – 6 to continue to take part in swimming sessions by qualified swim coaches. To continue to offer reception pupils an after school club to help with transition to year 1. Albion Foundation coach to work in reception to help with PE lessons to assist pupils outcomes.

2) **Intent-** To increase participation in competitive sport.

Implementation- Continue to enter teams into both the boys' and girls' football league. Develop competitions within school across year groups/phases with the intra school tournament model. Increase the number of after-school clubs available. To increase the number of girls involved in competitive sport. Compete in at least 3 school games competitions school games calendar with the ambition of achieving the gold award. All pupils from years 2 to 6 will compete in intra-school tournaments throughout the year. Pupils in year 4 to 6 to be given the opportunity to compete in sports competitions against other schools each term.

Impact- Boys' and girls' football teams entered the regional football league. Boys' and girls' entered and won a mixed football tournament at the WBA dome. Year 3 and 4 girls' football team entered and won a regional football tournament at WBA dome. After school clubs increased with an additional lunch time and after school club targeting the engagement of girls in sport – 100% of club spaces were filled. Pupils from years 3 to 6 took part in two intra-school tournaments which is 360 pupils in total who accessed this. Pupils from years 3-6 represented the school in sports competitions this academic year. Gold award was achieved for the school games mark. Gold award was achieved for the Youth Sport Trust schools quality mark. All pupils competed in school sports day from nursery to year 6.

NEXT steps – To continue to enter boys' and girls' regional football league. To enter a broader range of sports competitions. To increase intra-school tournaments for year 2 to access this meaning that 400 pupils will compete in intra-school competitions. Enter the school games mark to once again achieve a gold award. To enter a broader range of competitions against other schools to provide opportunity for more pupils to compete.

3) **Intent-** To increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.

Implementation- All staff to have CPD program next academic year. Yearly subscription of Get Set 4 PE and DD Mix to aid the teaching of PE within school. CPD twilight session from DD Mix to increase confidence in teaching dance. Staff meetings to regularly update teachers on updates in PE.

Impact- 12 teachers accessed the CPD program this year. 92% stated that their practice improved due to the CPD program. Subscription of Get set 4 PE was retained to aid the teaching of PE. CPD session delivered by the Albion Foundation to assist the use of the STEP principle in PE lessons. Three staff meetings throughout the year on improving practice as well as national curriculum updates in PE. Progression of skills updated to assist teachers with teaching of PE as well as with assessment of PE.

NEXT steps – At least 12 teachers to access the CPD program this year as well as reception teachers. To continue with the subscription of Get set 4 PE to aid teachers with teaching of PE. To deliver staff meetings on use of progression of skills, four corner plenary, STEP principle and assessment of PE.

4) **Intent-** To provide broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils so that a higher percentage of children access extracurricular activities.

Implementation- Albion Foundation to deliver lunch time clubs to pupils who can not access after school clubs. Albion Foundation to deliver gymnastics and dance after school clubs to increase participation in sports clubs. Albion Foundation to deliver after school clubs for 3 days per week and lunch time clubs for 3 days per week. Albion Foundation to deliver girls football coaching for 1 day per week after school to increase participation in girls football. Pupils from year 4 – 6 will take part in swimming sessions by qualified swim coaches.

Impact – 87% of the school accessed a lunch time club or after school club during this academic year. Gymnastics and dance clubs were delivered in Autumn and Spring term which were fully subscribed. A specific girls football after school club ran throughout the academic year and all were fully subscribed – this meant that pupils from years 3 to 6 accessed this. There was also a celebration event which celebrated 'The Biggest Ever Girls Football Session' which meant that every girl from year 1 to year 6 took part in a football session on 7th March – pupils were then given letters to take part in football outside of school at local football teams as well as The Albion Foundation. Pupils from years 4 – 6 took part in swimming lessons free of charge this year. Ferndale received the partnership school award for The Albion Foundation due to our work this year – pupils had the chance to meet WBA footballers as well as have an assembly with staff from the Premier League accompanied by the Premier League trophy.

NEXT steps – To continue to deliver lunch time clubs for 3 days per week and after school clubs for 4 days per week. To continue to run the session for 'The Biggest Ever Girls Football Session'. Pupils from years 4 – 6 to continue taking part in swimming lessons this year. To increase the percentage of pupils who access lunch clubs and after school clubs to 100%.

5) **Intent-** To increase the amount of children working at the expected standard.

Implementation- Albion Foundation to continue work alongside teachers to help improve teaching and understanding of how to help pupils get to ARE. Subject lead to run differentiation workshops for staff to understand the importance of step and how this contributes towards helping children achieve are related expectations. Yearly subscription of Get Set 4 PE and DD Mix to aid the teaching of PE within school.

Impact- Staff voice survey taken to access where teachers require support and in which area of PE. CPD given to 12 teachers this academic year and 92% stated that this enhanced their teaching in PE. Get Set 4 PE subscription renewed to enhance PE planning and teaching. Progression of skills document updated and distributed to teachers in their own PE folder. 85% of school are currently working at expected standard in PE or better.

NEXT steps – To increase the number of teachers who access the CPD program. To continue to subscribe to Get Set 4 PE to help enhance PE planning. To update the progression of skills document for reception. To increase the number of pupils working at expected standard or better.

Actions to achieve key indicators

Key indicator 1: To increase the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.

- New equipment to be purchased for a variety of year groups based on pupil voice surveys.
- Pupils to come to school in sports kit to encourage participation in PE lessons.
- Coach to set up and run provision at lunch time targeted at a different year group for 3 days per week.
- All teachers to have a log in to GetSet4PE.
- Children to be identified who have not accessed any after school clubs previously – these children to be targeted during lunch time to raise their levels of physical activity.
- Children's participation in the daily mile to be tracked and celebrated within school.
- Children in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 to have access to Bikeability to develop their proficiency.
- Albion Foundation coach to be employed for 3 full days to target those children who are less physically active as well as providing a broader range of activities and opportunities at lunch time. Albion coach to work with pupils each afternoon to engage with pupils who do not access sport at lunch times or after school clubs. Increase the use of the daily mile tracker across school.
- Specific girls football session to be coached by the Albion Foundation to increase participation in girls football.

Key indicator 2: To increase participation in competitive sport.

- Two football teams (boys and girls) to continue with school staff running/managing them. Both teams to be entered into a local invitational league and tournaments.
- Marking of pitch ready to stage home matches and Sports Day.
- Competitions to be ran across phases. At least 3 across the academic year.
- All pupils from years 2 to 6 to take part in at least 2 intra school competitions this year.
- Compete in at least 3 school games competitions school games calendar with the ambition of retaining the gold award.
- Pupils in year 4 to 6 to be given the opportunity to compete in sports competitions against other schools each term.

Key indicator 3: To increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.

- Teacher to receive targeted support on identified areas of weakness by a member of staff within the school.
- Folder of evidence and resources to be created and regularly added to by expert and teacher.
- PE Lead to attend cluster meetings regularly and arrange 1:1 support or staff twilight sessions.
- PE Lead to ensure staff are using skills to improve the teaching and learning in school.
- PE Lead to use advice from others within the network to continue to develop the implementation of PE within the school.
- All teachers to continue using GetSet4PE.
- Lesson plans to be accessible and printable via the website.

- Teachers to use the tracking system online and statements to help identify children working at the expected standard.
- CPD opportunities and workshop for all teachers to work alongside Albion Foundation staff in PE lessons to help with their CPD and PE delivery.
- Twilight session to assist staff members in confidence in PE and dance teaching.

Key indicator 4: To provide broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils so that a higher percentage of children access extracurricular activities.

- PE Lead to create and use tracking system to track which children have applied for clubs and which children have received a club to track percentage across the year.
- PE Lead to send out termly children questionnaires to find out ways to raise engagement with after school clubs and act accordingly.
- PE Lead to change after school clubs every half term and react to feedback given by children through questionnaire responses.
- PE Lead to then allocate places to children for each club and track this to provide an overall percentage at the end of the year. This tracker is used to ensure children are being given a fair opportunity to attend after school clubs throughout the academic year
- Albion Foundation to deliver lunch time clubs to pupils who can not access after school clubs.
- Albion Foundation to deliver gymnastics and dance after school clubs to increase participation in sports clubs.
- Pupil voice questionnaire to choose after school clubs in line with what pupils would like to access.

Key indicator 5: To increase the amount of children working at the expected standard.

- PE Lead to ensure PE Premium is being spent effectively and efficiently
- PE Lead to observe lessons, monitor assessment sheets and photo evidence books.
- PE Lead to provide feedback to staff and support where necessary.
- PE Lead to offer support using a coaching and mentoring format to act on teachers weaknesses evident through observations/learning walks and teacher confidence surveys
- All teachers to have a log in to GetSet4PE.
- Lesson plans to be accessible and printable via the website.
- Teachers to use the tracking system online and statements to help identify children working at the expected standard.
- CPD opportunities and workshops available to staff.
- Updates to be shared with staff.
- Regular resources to be shared with staff.
- CPD opportunities and workshops available to staff.
- Previous swimming data for Year 4 and Year 5 to be used to identify which children did not make the expected standard in swimming. These children to be prioritised for extra catch-up swimming sessions.
- Albion Foundation to work alongside all teachers to help improve teaching and understanding of how to help pupils get to ARE.
- Subject lead to run PE workshops for staff to understand the importance of step and how this contributes towards helping children achieve are related expectations.
