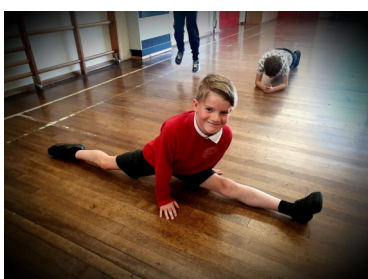

The programme is designed to help us all be a #ForceforNature and tackle the climate and ecological crisis. In the 'tech kit' we received a VR headset for our children to 'visit' the Rwandan jungle or go on a Soacewalk. They can also climb giant redwoods or swim in tropical reefs.

The kit also included blindfolds, to be used to explore senses, a seed collection bag for The Tree Council Seed Gathering Campaign. There was also seedling pots, booklets and posters, stickers and an example for a talking tree trail. We are thrilled to be part of this incentive and it will really enrich the experience our pupils have in the forest.
