Dear Parents,

After changing our pick-up arrangements so that all parents wait for their children on the playground, I initially said that people with dogs could also wait on the playground as long as the dogs were kept under control.

I have since taken advice from Lancashire County Council and have been told that dogs should not be permitted on a school site. Unfortunately, this is all areas of the school site, including the drive.

From next week, I will have to ask parents not to bring dogs with them when dropping off or collecting pupils unless there is another adult who can wait off site with the dog.

We do have some children who are nervous around dogs and although we would all like to think our dogs are friendly, incidents can happen and I would not want any child to be frightened, bitten or knocked over by someone's dog. There has also been an awful story in the press recently about a 10-year-old boy being killed after being attacked by a dog.

I hope you can understand the decision to say there will be no dogs allowed on the school site – this is a Lancashire County Council policy. Our first priority has to be safeguarding our pupils.
