Anti Bullying Week

Ash class have been looking at different ways of being kind to each other and have done some sorting activities of kind and unkind things. They have also been focusing on one kind word throughout the week and starting their days with a 'Hello, how are you?' and a handshake.

In Oak Class they have made 'friendship flowers' with kind words as the petals to create a kindness garden.

This week Willow have made puzzle pieces with one kind word on to show we are all connected, made one kind word acrostic poems, made hands with one kind word on them to stick together and make a wreath and done a PSHE session on prejudice and not judging others. Afterschool club have been doing some Kindness Bingo and Teambuilding activities based around friendship.

Maple class have been working with Fleetwood Town Football Club to work on a being a character and having kind characteristics. They too have made jigsaw pieces with the One Kind Word theme. In Elm Class they have been making Kindness posters, had a PSHE lesson about celebrating differences - children role played different scenarios and the right/ wrong way to behave and have had an Anti-bullying lesson provided by 'Anti-Bullying Alliance' about bullying, feelings, and using kind words.
