Lancaster on Ice Trip:

Dear Parents and Carers,

The Governing Body (GB) reviewed the way in which it supports Fleetwood's Charity School and has put together an action plan for the next 12 months. This can be seen on the school website in due course.

One of the things we thought we could do much better is communicating with parents and families about the work we do. So myself as Chair and Janet Danson-Smith, Vice Chair, attended the parents' forum to talk about our contribution to school life and both the support and challenge that we bring to help the school move forward and improve its performance. Although the numbers attending that meeting were small, we felt it was a good start to developing a closer dialogue between school, governors and parents. The next meeting will be in the spring term and we hope to be able to attend and deepen our understanding of parents and carers perspective on what is good about the school and what could be further improved.

In our attempt to improve communication between governors and families we decided to write to you at the end of each term and to share with you the main focus of the term's priorities for the GB and the aspirations for the following term.

The names and photographs of all the governors will appear on the website in January. We meet as a full GB once a term. Similarly, the three sub-committees – Ethos, chaired by Rev. Andy Shaw, Curriculum and Standards, chaired by David Sanders and Resources chaired by Janet Danson-Smith, meet once a term and support the work of the school generally and the Headteacher, in particular. Mrs. Gladwin, as you might expect, is a member of all three sub-committees and the full Governing Body. Together we have high expectations of the school and high aspirations for the performance of your sons and daughters.

As you will be very aware the last two years have been extremely difficult for everyone involved in children's education so our first priority has been the health and well-being of both pupils and staff and hopefully this has come across to you very strongly in your contact with the school. Thereafter we have had a number of key priorities such as:-

* reviewing the curriculum with a focus on English and mathematics, ensuring that progress is made across the subjects;

* reviewing pupil performance – trying to ensure all children achieve their potential

* resources – maintaining and improving the building and ensuring any expenditure provides value for money; and

* reviewing the GB performance and developing an action plan – please see the school website next term.

I will talk about these items and the progress made in more detail in my next newsletter.
