#### Statutory Assessments

This year, all schools will be once again taking part in statutory assessments set by the DFE.

Year 6 SATS will be taking place week beginning 9<sup>th</sup> May.

Year 2 assessments will be taking place week beginning 16<sup>th</sup> May. (In Year 2 the overall judgement made is based on teacher assessment; test papers are used to back-up the teacher judgement).

Teachers will ensure all pupils are well-prepared and it is important that pupils are not made to feel worried or anxious. I always tell them that tests are a chance for them to show off and demonstrate how much they have learnt through school.

It is important that pupils are in school as much as possible in the lead up to test weeks so as not to miss out on revision and preparation. For Year 6 pupils, looking at practice questions at home between now and then will also help build confidence.

Year 1 pupils will take part in a phonics screening test in June and Year 4 pupils will have a multiplication check test, also in June.

Our whole school end of year assessment week will be the last week in June.

## **Swimming**

The rest of Year 3 and 4, who did not swim this term, have been split into 2 groups. We have kept the groups fairly small as there are a lot of non-swimmers. The first group will start lessons on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> April (these children have been given individual letters). The second group will go swimming after the half-term holiday in May or added in when there is space.

If your child is a complete non-swimmer it would be useful for them to have some lessons outside school at one of the local pools, to get them used to the water and to start them off with the basics. We currently have a lot of pupils in Year 4 and Year 5 who are non-swimmers.

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are nearly at the end of the Easter term and as promised I am writing to update you of the main activities undertaken by the Governing Body (GB) during this period . I am delighted to inform you of two new governors who were formally approved by the GB at its last meeting, namely Mr. Lee Hodgett as your parent governor and Mrs. Nattie Wright as a co-opted governor. We hope that they enjoy their time with us and I am sure that they will make a substantial contribution to the progress of the school.

A key focus at this time of the year is the budget and I am pleased to share with you that the financial situation is looking good for the next couple of years and whilst we will still have to be careful, the additional investment that we have made in the last year to help support children's health and well-being and raising standards will continue into the next year and possibly the year after. Undoubtedly this will help improve children's learning opportunities and contribute to raising standards. Formal assessments will take place in the summer term so more on the outcomes in July.

All three sub-committees have met since I last wrote to you and the main focus of their work has been:

i) Ethos Committee - Collective Worship (Year 6 delivered a whole school worship on thankfulness); KS2 You Tube Carol Concert; reviews of pastoral care, effectiveness of RE provision and global issues related to RE; consideration of the positive comments of a visit by the Diocesan adviser, Jo Snape.

ii) Curriculum and Standards Committee – School Improvement Plan (SIP) – a comprehensive document covering the full range of the curriculum across the school and setting targets for the year, whilst there is no room for complacency, the evaluation of progress against the targets show that generally, good progress is being made.

iii) Resources Committee – the early indicative budget and using it to produce the business plan for the next year; upgrading the alarm system, emergency lighting and legionella works; preparing a bid to replace the flat roof; cloakroom remodelling project; H&S; and staffing

Also the full GB met on the 1st March and at which the minutes of the 3 sub-committees were reported for comment and scrutiny. The meeting took 2 hours so I will refer briefly only to the key items which were as follows:-

\* safeguarding – the GB has substantial responsibilities for safeguarding and at this meeting the main task was reviewing our role under 'Keeping Children Safe in Education'. Our view is that the school can be proud of what it achieves in this respect but it must always be the number one priority;

\* general review of standards – pupil performance, mid year reviews and teacher appraisal. Essentially this was an interim review because the key results will emerge next term and be considered at the summer meetings of Curriculum & Standards and the full GB meetings.

\* policy approval – consideration and approval was given to the updated local authority policies mainly relating to personnel. This item is one which appears on most full GB meeting agendas.

\* governor training and development – again this appears as an item on most full GB meetings. Currently there is a lot of activity to ensure that governors are well-prepared and well-supported to fulfil their role.

\* school budget – agreed a means of finalising the budget and reviewing pupil numbers and staffing

\* approval and evaluation of school visits – this also is a standard item and on this occasion reports were received on the excellent skating visit before Christmas

\* school emergency plan – agreed the means of updating and finalising the plan

\* governor links with subject leads – each subject taught in the school has a teacher who is the designated lead for that subject and to whom is linked a governor or small group of governors – progress will be reviewed during the summer term

\* buildings – as above + new play equipment considered and reviewed possibilities of outdoor learning classroom,

\* H&S (health and safety) – a key topic reported both to Resources Sub and the full GB and on this occasion reports were received on training that had been undertaken.

Finally, I would like to ask a favour . It would be good to receive some feedback about this letter. Is it helpful for you to know about the work of the GB? If so, does this letter meet your needs – is it too long, too short, too detailed or not covering the key areas about which you would like to receive our comments.
