

Holidays in Term Time

As has been previously communicated, pupils are not permitted to take time off school to go on holiday. I recognise that a holiday can be a positive experience for a child and that they can learn a great deal from experiencing new places and different cultures. With this in mind, I will consider authorising holiday applications however the criteria are: the pupils should miss no more than 5 days of school; it must not clash with any assessment period; the pupil's attendance must be over 94%; there should only be one request within a school year.

Applications that do not meet the criteria will be unauthorised and holidays where the pupil is out of school for more than 4 days could incur a fine from the local authority. The best option is not to take holidays in term-time.

All the staff would like to congratulate Year 6 on the maturity and resilience they have displayed this week whilst undertaking their SATs tests. I am sure you will have seen on the news the controversy around how difficult some of the tests were and how pupils across the country struggled to complete them in the time given.

The tests themselves are really not a true reflection of how much progress children make through school and a good education is about so much more than test scores. We have never been a school that teaches to tests and never will be!

All our Year 6 pupils did their absolute best and we are really proud of them. We didn't have any tears; they literally took it all in their stride and did everything asked of them.

Road Safety

It has been brought to my attention that there are some parents who allow their children to run down the hill at home time and therefore are unsupervised in the road. In order to ensure that all our pupils are kept safe, please can I request that you keep your children with you whilst walking away from school and also make them aware of the dangers associated with being on the roads.

Next half-term, we have some units of work to deliver linked to road safety however this needs to be enforced at all times to avoid a child being seriously hurt.



BATTLE ROYALE

Battle Royale games have become very popular over the fast couple of years, and most tend to follow a very similar setup. Taking Forthite as an example, 100 players drop into a map, loot buildings for weapons and armour and attempt b bear all the other players to be crowned victor at the out function are the setup. the end. If you've ever seen the Hunger Games movies, you'll have an idea of what this entails. Each game can take up to 20 minutes (assuming you last to the end) and can be restarted relatively uickly once 100 free players have been found.

SEASONAL UPDATES

Every 10 weeks or so Fortnite is updated with a new season. This essentially adds new things like skins and emotes to the game, while also sometimes changing up the game map in interesting ways. These seasons are free to everybody and don't require additional money to play, though battle passes for each season can be bought with V-Bucks. A battle pass will typically allow a player to earn experience faster and gain fun in-game items by completing a host of daily challenges.

IS FORTNITE ADDICTIVE?

Fortnite is at the forefront of gaming addiction discussions because it is so popular with young people. But whether it actually contributes to gaming addiction is up for debate. WHO (World Health Organisation) have up for debate. WHO (World Health Organisation) have classified gaming as a legitimate addiction, but this is not soluly a concern with Fortnite. Signs of addiction can include initiability when not playing, lying about the amount of time played and a preoccupation with thoughts of the next gaming session. Realistically, it must be down to parents and cares to recognise these symptoms and act accordingly if they think they are developing.

CROSSPLAY IS AVAILABLE

One of the wonderful things about Fornite is that it can be played cross platform. This means that no matter what platform a person plays on (PC, PlayStation 4, Xbor One etc) they can play with hiends who own the game on a different platform. To do this, an Epic Games account must first be created online (which is free) and then lineds with your platform account. Doing this removes the age oild boundary of not being able to play together because you don't have the same console and opens up a whole new world of playing online with thiends.

FREE TO PLAY ... OR IS IT?

While Fortnite is technically free to play (in that you can download and play it without paying) it does come with the caveat that spending money on things like skins and emotes in-game is heavily pushed to players. The currency used in game is called 'V Bucks' and can be bought with real money through the game's online store. It's worth remembering that these purchases are absolutely not necessary, are cosmetic only and that V Bucks med in-game with enough play time can be ea

IS FORTNITE VIOLENT?
