Tips for parents and carers.

We understand that starting school can be a challenging time for you and your child as you face big changes, but let us assure you that all members of staff in Reception will care for and teach your child to the best of their abilities. The needs of our children are at the heart of everything we do at Flowery Field.

If your child becomes upset at drop off the best thing you can do is say goodbye, give a quick and happy kiss and cuddle, then leave. It is most likely that those tears will stop before the register is finished and you are always welcome to call school to check that your child did settle.

Share your child's achievements with school; this could be medals or certificates earned or even getting dressed all by themselves for the first time. Teachers will value this information and these 'wow' moments will be celebrated.

We ask children to put their belongings into their named tray. Sometimes things still manage to go missing, so please write their name in all belongings.

If you ask your child what they did at school and they say 'nothing' try talking about your own day, they will soon want to talk about themselves. If you have any concerns or worries, please speak to your child's teacher. Even if we don't always have the answer we will do our best to help.
