

## Safeguarding

It may not be possible for you to become fully familiar with our Child Protection policy in your short time here. This summary will give you the key information you may need:

## **Key Child Protection Staff:**

- The designated lead for Child Protection/Safeguarding is Claire Silk (Deputy Head).
- The designated deputies for Child Protection/Safeguarding are Karen Pearson (Assistant Head), Sue Smith (Assistant SENCO) and Lesley Jeffers (Learning Mentor).

## If you have a Child Protection concern:

- Write up your concern ensuring that you have signed and put the date on
- Ask for it to be given to one of the CP/Safeguarding leads
- Always report and record your concerns as soon as possible. Prompt communication is essential for effective safeguarding.
