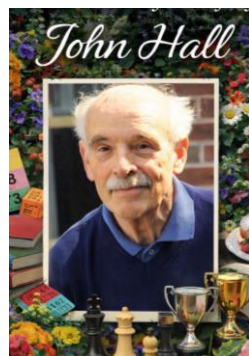
Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

Earlier this academic year, lots of people responded to our call for help to plant a 'green' fence (made up of plants and trees) around the perimeter of the playground. The Woodland Trust have now delivered the plants that were ordered, but we are hoping to make an even bigger impact!
