<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Five Pillars of Islam (see KS2 Islam KO) are extremely important to the lives of a Muslim.</li> <li>Qur'an was revealed to Prophet Muhammad by Angel Jibril.</li> <li>The Qur'an consists of stories from important Muslim Prophets e.g. Ibrahim, Musa, Isa, Prophet Muhammad.</li> <li>These stories are shared with Jewish people and Christians e.g. Ibrahim (Abraham), Musa (Moses), Isa (Jesus).</li> <li>Muslims celebrate of Eid- ul-Fitr as an opportunity to celebrate the success of the fasting at Ramadan and thanking Allah for help, strength and self-control.</li> <li>Muslims celebrate Eid ul-Adha, which is a celebration of Ibrahim's faith being tested when he was asked to sacrifice his son Isma'il, this festival also has links to Hajj pilgrimage.</li> <li>Muslims believe in giving Sadaqah.</li> <li>The 'Umrah' is an Islamic pilgrimage to Mecca that can be undertaken at any time of the year, in contrast to the Hajj, which has specific dates according to the Islamic lunar calendar.</li> </ul>	Be kind to your parents, particularly in their old age.
