continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.		
Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.		
Confirmatory PCR tests following a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test result are to be temporarily suspended from Tuesday 11 January. This will mean that anyone who receives a positive LFD test result will be required to self- isolate immediately and will not be required to take a confirmatory PCR test. Close contacts will now be identified via NHS Test and Trace and education settings will no longer be expected to undertake contact tracing.		
As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work with the positive case and/or their parent to identify close contacts. Contacts from a school setting will only be traced by NHS Test and Trace where the positive case and/or their parent specifically identifies the individual as being a close contact.		
Individuals are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, and any of the following apply:

		Confirmatory PCR tests:			
		Staff and pupils with a positive LFD test result should self- isolate in line with the stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection. They will also need to get a free PCR test to check if they have COVID-19. Whilst awaiting the PCR result, the individual should continue to self- isolate. If the PCR test is taken within 2 days of the positive lateral flow test, and is negative, it overrides the self-test LFD test and the pupil can return to school, as long as the individual doesn't have COVID-19 symptoms.			
		If a pupil is awaiting collection, they should be left in a room on their own if possible and safe to do so. A window should be opened for fresh air ventilation if possible. Appropriate PPE should also be used if close contact is necessary



Staff and secondary pupil's shall test themselves twice a week at home. Negative LFT test result – Individuals can continue to attend work, follow guidance and use protective measures. Positive LFT test result – INDIVIDUALS WITH A POSITIVE LFT RESULT WILL NEED TO SELF-ISOLATE IMMEDIATELY IN LINE WITH THE STAY-AT-HOME GUIDANCE. They must report their results to NHS Test and Trace as soon as the test is complete They must also inform the school/nursery of their result so the school can identify close contacts and start the self-isolation process. Individuals with a positive LFD test result must self-isolate in line with the stay-at-home guidance. They will also need to arrange a lab-based polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test to confirm the result. Whilst awaiting the PCR result, the individual should continue to self-isolate. If the PCR test is taken within 2 days of the positive lateral flow test, and is negative, it overrides the self-test LFD test and the pupil can return to school, as long as the individual doesn't have COVID-19 symptoms.
