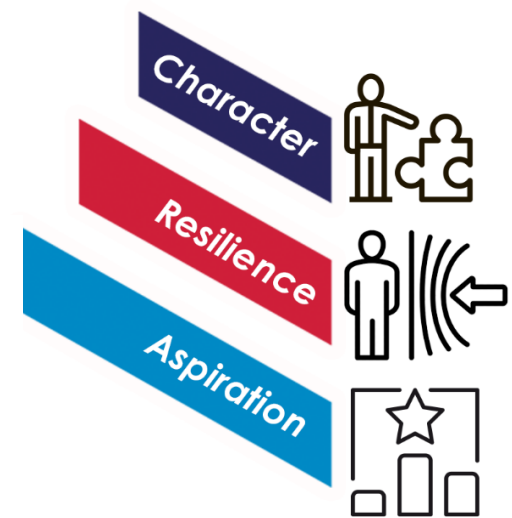


Core Values for History



Core Value	Meaning	Examples
Character	<i>Character</i> is a set of personal traits or dispositions that evoke specific emotions, inform motivation and guide conduct.	<p>Where does this apply in History?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will learn about monarchs that have been successful and those who have allowed their character flaws to lead to their demise. Students have the opportunity to consider what character traits make the best leaders and how decision can have consequences that are far reaching.
Resilience	<i>Resilience</i> is the ability to adapt and cope in difficult situations and have the confidence to seek support from others.	<p>Where does this apply in History?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In year 8 pupils explore how immigration has impacted Britain and how the decisions made by the British Empire had consequences that highlight the resilience of marginalised communities. Pupils explore the resilience of the Jewish people through the Holocaust and examine how this supported their ability to survive.
Aspiration	<i>Aspiration</i> is the ability to form dreams, hopes, or ambitions to achieve a life goal. Developing aspirations provides a sense of purpose and direction.	<p>Where does this apply in History?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Pupils explore how peoples' aspirations through History have led to change that have been a force for good. Pupils explore different career choices and develop a passion for academic study which continues through to A level.
