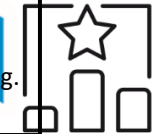
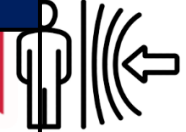


# Core Values for

Character



Core Value	Meaning	Examples
<b>Character</b>	<i>Character</i> is a set of personal traits or dispositions that evoke specific emotions, inform motivation and guide conduct.	<p><b>Where does this apply in History?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students will learn about monarchs that have been successful and those who have allowed their character flaws to lead to their demise.</li> <li>Students have the opportunity to consider what character traits make the best leaders and how decision can have consequences that are far reaching.</li> </ul>
<b>Resilience</b>	<i>Resilience</i> is the ability to adapt and cope in difficult situations and have the confidence to seek support from others.	<p><b>Where does this apply in History?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In year 8 pupils explore how immigration has impacted Britain and how the decisions made by the British Empire had consequences that highlight the resilience of marginalised communities.</li> <li>Pupils explore the resilience of the Jewish people through the Holocaust and examine how this supported their ability to survive.</li> </ul>
<b>Aspiration</b>	<i>Aspiration</i> is the ability to form dreams, hopes, or ambitions to achieve a life goal. Developing aspirations provides a sense of purpose and direction.	<p><b>Where does this apply in History?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Pupils explore how peoples' aspirations through History have led to change that have been a force for good.</li> <li>Pupils explore different career choices and develop a passion for academic study which continues through to A level.</li> </ul>
