Core Value	Meaning	Example
Character	<i>Character</i> is a set of personal traits or dispositions that evoke specific emotions, inform motivation and guide conduct.	<p>What does this look like in Law?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Law builds character in our students by increasing our understanding of individual's needs, rights and responsibilities. Students debate issues of morality and how these conflicts with legal frameworks. Students become motivated through their studies of law to follow the conduct required within wider society.
Resilience	<i>Resilience</i> is the ability to adapt and cope in difficult situations and have the confidence to seek support from others.	<p>What does this look like in Law?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Studying law requires a great degree of tenacity and resilience due to the demanding nature of understanding legal frameworks, key terminology and being able to debate in a logical manner. Students develop confidence through studying law, as they become adaptable to debate and challenge ideas in a diplomatic manner to have their voice heard.
Aspiration	<i>Aspiration</i> is the ability to form dreams, hopes, or ambitions to achieve a life goal. Developing aspirations provides a sense of purpose and direction.	<p>What does this look like in Law?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Many of our students who study law aspire to continue the subject at university, we facilitate this desire through taking students to the law courts, working with law firms and making clear links to how law is relevant to a range of careers.
