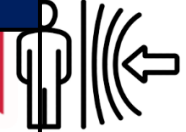


Core Values for

Core Value	Meaning	Example
Character	<i>Character</i> is a set of personal traits or dispositions that evoke specific emotions, inform motivation and guide conduct.	In art we promote and develop the following character values: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Leadership skills, students are encouraged to take the role of a leader and help support their peers. • Be a positive role model within the classroom and the local community. • Self-motivation, when carrying out all written and practical work. • Be curious of the wider world and the vast cultures and religions. • Communication skills, students are introduced to a range of communication skills, which allows them to share their creative ideas in a confident and clear way.
Resilience	<i>Resilience</i> is the ability to adapt and cope in difficult situations and have the confidence to seek support from others.	In art we promote and develop the following resilience values: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Withstand constructive criticism to help grow and develop not just as a student but a whole person. • Willingness to explore and translate new and innovative ideas and display them through practical outcomes. • Identify and solve problems when designing and producing final outcomes. • Use art as a way of coping with stress and anxiety, to help express inner thoughts and feelings.
Aspiration	<i>Aspiration</i> is the ability to form dreams, hopes, or ambitions to achieve a life goal. Developing aspirations provides a sense of purpose and direction.	In art we promote and develop the following aspirational values: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Build and apply a repertoire of knowledge, skills and understanding in art, craft and design. • Make students aware of the opportunities that are available to them, and the creative and technical skills required. • Promote future education and make career links to jobs within the industry of art and design.
