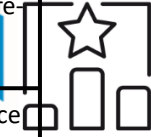


Core Values for

Core Value	Meaning	Example
Character	<i>Character</i> is a set of personal traits or dispositions that evoke specific emotions, inform motivation and guide conduct.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In Economics students are by the very nature of the course forced to look at scenarios that are causing problems for society but offer measured and academic responses to such issues. We also build the character of a student through encouraging life-long studying skills that will be beneficial for future jobs and studying.
Resilience	<i>Resilience</i> is the ability to adapt and cope in difficult situations and have the confidence to seek support from others.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students are encouraged throughout the course to gain resilience and work on self-improvement for their results. Students will be presented with a wealth of resources to support wider learning, but they must take that step.
Aspiration	<i>Aspiration</i> is the ability to form dreams, hopes, or ambitions to achieve a life goal. Developing aspirations provides a sense of purpose and direction.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In Economics A-Level, students are taught to view problems through methodology, examine and critique policies using both numerical and academic arguments We will encourage students to reach for the highest aspirations and aim to forge connections with the local universities who offer economic related courses.
