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Activity Survey Summary

The Activity Survey is based on 5,228 Year 11 students who completed their statutory education in June 2020 (51.0% male, 48.6% female and a very small 0.4% other/not confirmed gender).

94.5% of the cohort is cohort is participating/ participation participation

Key Findings

- 93.9% of the cohort are recorded as participating. The majority are undertaking full time education (88.4%) with smaller groups in employment with training (3.1%) and full time training (2.3%).
- 0.7% of the cohort are undertaking re-engagement activities. The total number participating or working towards participating this year is 4,941 or 94.5%.
- 0.3% of the cohort are taking a temporary break in learning. This equates to 16 young people and is a small decrease compared to 0.4% in 2019.
- 0.9% of the cohort have secured employment without training. This is the same proportion as in 2019.
- The combined proportion of the cohort recorded as NEET or Current Situation Not Known is 4.2%.












Destinations Time Series

Destinations Glossary

PARTICIPATING

All full time education destinations including school sixth form and sixth form college, further education, higher education and gap year students (confirmed deferred offer); young people in custody as they undertake mandatory education.

Employment and training destinations including: employment with accredited training including apprenticeships, self-employment alongside part time study, working not for reward (voluntary work / internship) alongside part time study.

Training funded by the Education and Skills Funding Agency e.g. Traineeships and study programmes delivered through independent learning provides.

WORKING TOWARD PARTICIPATION

There are specific activities which are not defined as participating and viewed as working towards participation; they include following a programme of re-engagement such as: ESF/YEI Participation projects and personal development opportunities or NEET where a start date in accredited learning has been agreed.











Destinations Glossary (2)

ACCEPTABLE BREAK IN LEARNING

There are some circumstances where a break in learning is permitted but contact is maintained to offer progression support when the young person is ready; these are: Teenage Parent, Illness and Pregnancy

NOT PARTICIPATING

The definition of not participating can include situations where the young person is undertaking some activity but may not be undertaking the minimum number of guided learning hours (GLHs) or no accredited learning is included Part time education; employment without any accredited learning or where it is not combined with part time study.

Young people in the NEET (not in education, employment or training) group or not available for learning or work.

Not known – this includes young people where we are not able to confirm their current activity.
