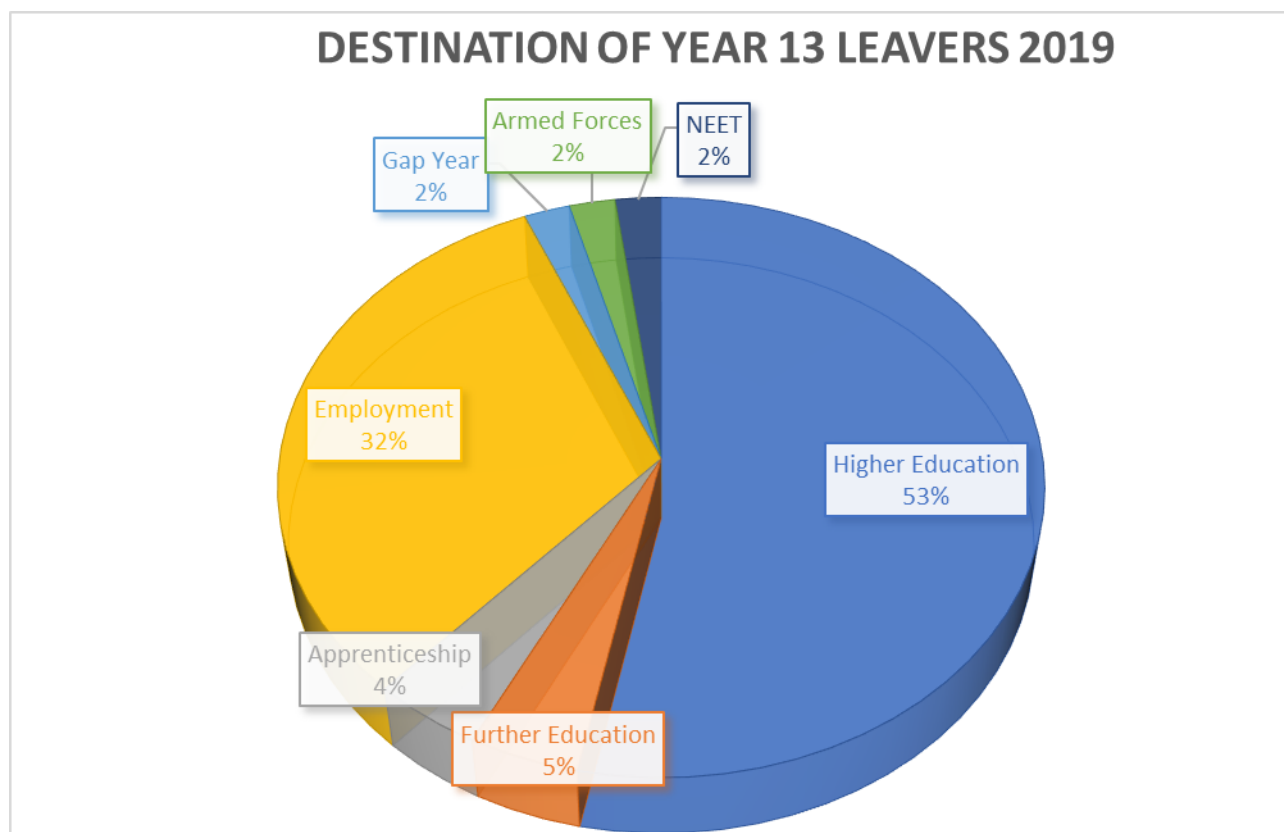


## Year 13 Leavers Destination Report 2019

49\* students enrolled into Year 13 in September 2018, 47 completed courses in the summer of 2019.

The two students who left prior to completing their level 3 courses both continued in part time employment and with voluntary placements linked to their future career aspirations while seeking apprenticeships, both have since found full time employment.

\*50 students were on roll officially in Year 13, but 1 was taught in Year 12 after re-starting Level 3 courses.



### Progression to Higher Education

Of the 25 students progressing onto Higher Education:

- 11 students were accepted to Russell Group or top-ranking universities (46%)
- 9 students progressed onto STEM courses.
- 7 students progressed onto social science, arts and humanities courses.
- 3 students progressed onto health care courses (including nursing and oral health).
- 3 students progressed onto sport and related courses.
- 2 students progressed onto business and related courses.
- 1 student progressed onto law.

### Progression to other destinations

1 student took a planned Gap Year and was working abroad, this student decided not to apply for university in 2020.

**2 students progressed onto Further Education courses**, one to do an Art Foundation course and another to do an Access to HE course, both then progressed to university to study Art & Design and Midwifery respectively in 2020.

**1 student was going through the recruitment process for the Armed Forces on leaving school.**

**17 students entered employment or took up apprenticeships** on leaving school in 2019, this included:

- Full and part time employment in health and social care, retail, travel and tourism, hospitality, logistics and local government.
- Level 3 apprenticeships in health and social care.
- Cadet Training with the Merchant Navy.

**1 student was unavailable for work or further study for medical reasons and is therefore NEET.**
