
Maths

We will be looking at:

- Place Value within 10 including finding one more and less than a number, comparing numbers using greater than and less than symbols and using a number line.
- Addition and subtraction within 10
- Shape including recognising and naming 2D and 3D shapes.

Science

Pupils will have lots of opportunities to explore the world around them and raise their own questions. Children will explore the season of Autumn and observe changes that they see. They will experience different types of scientific enquiries, including practical activities, and begin to recognise ways in which they might answer scientific questions

Harry The

History

In History, we are looking forward to learning about vehicles from the past and vehicles from the present. We will begin by exploring different types of transport and sorting these based on their characteristics. The children will have the opportunity to explore vehicles from both beyond living memory and within living memory and make observations about how these have changed over time. We will learn about the invention of the hot air balloon, aeroplane and rocket. The children will be able to explain how life is different since improvements in air travel.

Music

Our topic this half term will be based on the festival of Harvest. The children will learn about where their food comes from and why Christians celebrate Harvest. The children will have the opportunity to taste different fruits from around the world and we will explore where these come from. We will explore charities who are working to improve the lives of people living in countries where the harvest has failed. We will also spend time learning about Harvest festivals in Poland and Italy.

Pupils will reflect on why they are special and who is special to them. We will use the story of Elmer to explore that we are all different but a part of our class family.

We will learn about relationships and how saying sorry can enable us to mend relationships with others. Pupils will learn different ways of saying sorry and use role play to explore these. Pupils will begin to use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes. We will learn songs such as 'I'm a train', 'Have you brought your whispering voice?' and 'Boom Chicka Boom'
