Curriculum Implementation: how we do it at Gagle Brook

The teaching and implementation of the Art and Design curriculum at Gagle Brook Primary and Nursery School is based on the National Curriculum and each of our topics, is built upon from a termly, enquiry-based question. The progression of knowledge and skills is mapped out in our progression document and in further detail through our long-term planning. Enriching experiences such as art weeks, galleries of children's work and educational visits are also an integral part of our school's teaching and learning.

Through carefully crafted, active lessons, our children will learn to:

- Develop creativity and imagination through a range of complex activities using tactile elements and materials,
- Increase their awareness of the roles and purposes of Art and Design in different times and cultures,
- Foster an enjoyment and appreciation of the visual arts.

Curriculum Impact: the celebration of learning

Ongoing formative assessment takes place throughout the year via lesson observations, pupil voice and book looks. Teachers use this information to inform future lessons; ensuring children are supported and challenged appropriately. Age related expectation levels are reported to the parents at the end of the academic year.
