INTENT

At Gagle Brook, we believe PE is a fundamental part of the curriculum. We deliver high quality, fun and engaging Physical Education lessons to champion our pupils' successes to allow them to lead a healthy and active life. We aim to allow our pupils to develop competence and confidence in a physical, mental and social skills to support their health, well-being and fitness. Therefore, we believe that our children should be physically active every day, whether through daily physical activity, PE lessons, lunchtime or extra-curricular activities. We provide all children with that opportunity to compete in sport and other activities that build character and help to embed our school values such as teamwork, resilience and respect.

By providing a range of engaging physical activities and sport with an emphasis on life skills.

IMPACT

On leaving Gagle Brook, pupils will have:

- The ability to acquire new skills, knowledge and understanding to perform in a range of physical activities with confidence and competence.
- A positive understanding and attitudes towards participation in physical activity and leading a healthy lifestyle.
- The ability to swim at least 25 metres before the end of Year 6 and a knowledge of how to remain safe in and around water.
- An exceptional level of creativity and imagination in their techniques, tactics and analysis to improve their own and others performance.

Access to high quality Physical Education provision, creating a positive impact on behaviour and the development of life skills for all pupils	Specialist PE Primary School Teacher	£7500	As a result of employing a Physical Education specialist, it has had a significant impact on the learning behaviours and resilience of our children and the opportunities we can offer the children here at Gagle Brook Primary School. Our PE specialist has created an environment which has encouraged the children to be active, learn to work together as a team, experience different sports and the build-up of skills and knowledge. Children have been able to participate in lunchtime sporting activities as well as having a consistent after school club which has rotated between key stages. The positive impact on our small school has been huge.

These festivals provide the children of our school opportunities to experience competitions and sporting values away from our site.

As a result of zoning our playground with the use of the additional equipment, children have been provided with support in self-regulation and structured physical activities that regulate them emotionally and physically.

Children in reception to Year 4 have had weekly active learning sessions. Due to our Forest School Lead leaving in Term 4, we introduced Learning in Nature sessions to continue this work.

Registers have been kept to show the number of children accessing these opportunities. Running Club has continued to be a popular choice at lunchtimes as well as the Wednesday lunchtime sports club. There has also been a weekly after school sports club too led by our Sports Lead as well as a Quidditch club at lunchtimes in Term 6.
