WhatsApp new terms and conditions Parent Guide

What you need to know about its latest update

What is WhatsApp?

WhatsApp is a **free messaging service** available on desktop and mobile. It has lots of features available, including **direct messaging**, **video call**, **voice call and group chats**.

An **update to its terms and conditions** was due to go live in February this year. However, the announcement caused **millions of users to flock to other messaging services** over **privacy concerns**. The reaction was so great, WhatsApp **delayed the introduction of the update until May**.

The new terms and conditions

There's been **plenty of confusion** over the changes. **Lots of misinformation** – ironically spread on WhatsApp – **claimed the service would be able to share messages and recorded voice calls** with its parent company, Facebook, in order to tailor the adverts and services offered to you.

While the update has increased integration with Facebook, this was in fact put in place to make messaging with businesses easier, and provide transparency around the way the two platforms already share data.

Crucially, due to privacy laws, the update does not affect EU and UK users. A different update that lacks the new data-sharing terms will apply.

What data is stored?

Today, **WhatsApp collects user information within Europe in order to deliver services**. For example, you must provide a phone number in order to create an account.

Messages are **not stored by WhatsApp**. The service uses **end-to-end encryption**, which means that **once your message is delivered, it is deleted from WhatsApp's servers**.

What data is shared?

The information Facebook shares with WhatsApp is specified under their "Information We Collect" section of their European **privacy policy**. It includes **IP addresses**, **device and connection data and usage and log data**.

In response to the update to WhatsApp's terms and conditions, a Facebook spokesperson said: "For the avoidance of any doubt, it is still the case that WhatsApp does not share European region WhatsApp user data with Facebook for the purpose of Facebook using this data to improve its products or advertisements."

What can I do?

Data and privacy rights can be tricky topics to understand.

If your teen has **any questions** about the new WhatsApp terms and conditions, you could sit down and **talk about it step-by-step**. WhatsApp **has a <u>useful page</u> which explains in simpler terms what the new policy means**.

Finally, let them know that they can come to you at any time if they're worried about their data, whether on WhatsApp, or elsewhere.
