## Year 1



Year 1 have had a very productive half term! We have focussed on writing a range on non-fiction texts and discovered how to clearly explain multiplication and sharing in

our Maths lessons.

In Art we explored clay to create our own design on a clay tile and presented our learning about 'The Wright Brothers' to our families. Everyone who came to watch our presentation was proud of us!



### Year 2

WOW! What a half term. We have been learning about the artist Emma Bridgewater, experimenting with clay and making our own pots. In Science we have looked at materials, especially ones that are suitable for playground games. The children have been looking at playground equipment and investigating different types of balls, what they are made from and which ones bounce the highest or travel the furthest. In DT the children finished making their own mini pillows. They showed great sewing skills. In History we have been GCA historians looking at famous explorers such as Neil Armstrong and Christopher Columbus. The children showed great teamwork and produced a model of a ship that Christopher Columbus may have sailed in.

## Year 3





This half term Year 3 have really enjoyed their History topic on the Ancient Egyptians. Learning all about the pharaohs, pyramids and tombs, their favourite lesson being mummification - especially the process

of removing the brain through the nose via a long hook!

In English we have produced newspaper articles all about the eruption of Mount Vesuvius and the impact that had on the town of Pompeii and in Science we have been learning all about light.







In science, we have been learning about states of matter and had great fun doing experiments turning water into ice as well as exploring what makes ice melt. In history, the children have been learning about the Vikings including village life, weapons and armour. In maths we have learnt about decimals and in P.E, the children have been doing amazingly with their swimming and also

#### Year 5

This half term we have been learning about our bodies and how they change as we get older - the children have taken a very mature approach to learning about puberty. In English we looked at a historical legend text called Beowulf - the children have been writing an obituary and have written their own legend story. We have also learnt about the Industrial revolution and how it changed the dynamics of the country and how populations grew as factories were built and machinery took over manual labour. Year 5 also enjoyed learning about the Tour de France in their French lessons this half term with Mrs McCusker.
