

debase

(verb)

To debase something means to reduce its value or quality.

Etymology: mid 16th century (in the sense 'humiliate, belittle'): from de- 'down' + the obsolete verb *base* (compare with abase), expressing the notion 'bring down completely'.

Sentences containing the verb 'debase'

- The large raise that he gave himself **debased** his motives for running the charity.
- Her rude and aggressive manner debased the positive reference she got from her previous employer.
