Verb: make or enact laws or provide or prepare for (an occurrence).

Etymology: 1650s, "the enacting of laws," from
French législation (14c.), from Late
Latin legislationem (nominative legislatio), properly two words, legis
latio, "a proposing (literally 'bearing') of a law;"
