Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s)

I hope this letter finds you and your families well. We have had a busy half term so far and I wanted to take this opportunity to share with you some information on what has been happening in school.

Year 11 have been doing their last set of mock examinations. This is always a busy time as staff work hard to assess the papers as soon as possible and advise students on how best to use their time before the all-important GCSE exams begin. There are numerous opportunities for students to attend intervention sessions both during and after the school day which will continue to run.

With GCSEs on the horizon, Year 9 have been making choices about what they would like to study next year. For the second year running, students have been given a range of options which they can study at local colleges to supplement the school offer. You may have seen the BBC News story last week which featured our year 10 students who are accessing this 'Compass Curriculum' (link below if you missed it!) We are excited that there are three new options added to the offer next year where students can opt to go to Blackpool Sixth and study Psychology, Sociology and Economics.

Careers continue to be a focus across all of our school community as some of our year 7 students have been working with the Bitesize Careers programme. Students gained valuable career insights through a BBC Bitesize careers tour visit. Students provided feedback to the BBC via research and presentations, with Year 7 students acting as "roving reporters" and Year 10 students participating in group interviews. This collaboration benefited both students and the BBC.

This fun and engaging evening offers future parents/carers the opportunity to find out about school and gives the children a chance to take part in a treasure hunt taster event where they visit all departments, subjects and meet staff whilst becoming familiar with the building.

Everyone also received a book token so please encourage them to buy a book as well as continue to access our amazing Digital Library via our website.
