Maniplate (verb)

Verb: handle or control (a tool, mechanism, information, etc.) in a <u>skilful</u> manner OR control or influence (a person or situation) <u>cleverly</u> or unscrupulously.

Etymology: from French *manipulation*, from *manipule* "handful" (a pharmacists' measure), from Latin *manipulus* "handful, sheaf, bundle," from *manus* "hand"

Sentences containing the word 'manipulate' in different forms:

- He managed to manipulate the situation to his own advantage.
- He knows how to manipulate her parents in order to get what she wants.
- He had been accused of trying to manipulate the price of stock.
