

How to Self Sign Up for parents


Parents can access the **Parent Login** screen in two ways:

- From within the web browser type www.mychildatschool.com, this will open the Parent Login screen.
- 2. From the MyChildAtSchool mobile phone app, this will open the Parent Login screen.

Once in the Parent Login screen parents should follow these steps:

- o Click on the Sign Up link in the Parent Login screen.
- . Enter the school's Postcode or School ID.
- Select the school from the list in the dropdown.
- 。Click Continue.
- o Enter the registered email address.
- 。Click Sign Up.


Parents will see the message 'To complete your registration, we have sent an email to the email address you provided. Please access your email and follow the steps to create your password'.




Parents will receive an email from MyChildAtSchool with a link to a one time passcode.


- o Click on the link for the one time passcode. Enter



The MCAS Dashboard allows parents to view multiple Student MCAS accounts in one place.

All **Students** linked to a parent account will appear in the <u>top left dropdown</u> in the **Dashboard** with **School** and **Student Name**. This dropdown allows parents to switch between different **Student** accounts.

For the MCAS Desktop view in the example image below this shows the selected **Student** in Red.

- When you open the app - straight to attendance.



What is ClassCharts for parents?



- You will be able to use ClassCharts to keep track of your child's behaviour, view attendance records, access their weekly timetable, view assigned homework tasks and track scheduled detentions.
- If you have more than one child, you can access ClassCharts information about your children from a single, centralised parent account.
- ClassCharts for parents can be accessed via our website, or through our iOS and Android apps.
- A parent/carer guide will be shared with you to help you setup an account.


Equipment



190 days each year

10 days missed

19 days missed

29 days missed

38 days missed In school for the full 190 days **100% attendance**

Best chance of success-gets your child off to a flying start.

In school **180** days,10 days of learning missed **95% attendance**

This is the minimum target for all children.

In school for 171 days, 19 days of learning missed 90% attendance

This is a concern-less chance of success. We meet with families and monitor carefully if attendance falls to 90% as this is four weeks of school missed.

In school for **161** days, 29 days of learning missed **85% attendance**

This is worrying as almost 6 weeks of school missed in one year making it harder for your child to make progress. School Liaison Officer is involved.

In school for 152 days, 38 days of learning missed 80% attendance

This is a serious concern-not fair on your child! We work closely with the family and the School Liaison Officer to help overcome difficulties.

We expect students to attend everyday and on time

The minimum percentage we expect is 97% attendance

– this means missing no more than

5 DAYS IN THE YEAR

Support is available both in school and outside of school to help families improve attendance.

We encourage all children with minor illnesses (e.g. mild cold, sniffles) to still attend school.

- Fixed Penalty Notices can be issued for:
 - Unauthorised holidays during term-time
 - Persistent absence (PA attendance at or below 90%)
 - Failure to improve attendance after support
- Legal action could follow continued non-attendance.
- Home visits may take place if your child's attendance is a concern.
