

Protocol

(noun)

Noun: the official procedure or system of rules governing affairs of state or <u>diplomatic</u> occasions.

OR

the original draft of a <u>diplomatic</u> document, especially of the terms of a treaty agreed to in conference and signed by the parties.

Etymology: from Medieval Latin *protocollum* "draft," literally "the first sheet of a volume" (on which contents and errata were written), from Greek *prōtokollon* "first sheet glued onto a manuscript," from *prōtos* "first" (see **proto-**) + *kolla* "glue,"
