- the action of pacifying (making peace with) or placating (calm down) [someone] by acceding to their demands.
 - ETYMOLOGY: mid-15c., appesement, "pacification," from Old French apaisement "appeasement, calming," noun of action from apaisier "pacify, make peace, placate"
