(adjective)

increasing or increased in quantity, degree, or force by successive additions.

Etymology: from the Latin *cumulatus* for "to heap." If something is cumulative, it is heaped together so it can be counted up to get a total number.

- Cumulative frequencies is the running total of frequencies.
- The cumulative effects of the heavy rain were devastating floods.
