(noun)

- The act of damaging the good reputation of someone.

Etymology: c. 1300, from Old French defamer (13c., Modern

French diffamer), from Medieval Latin defamare, from Latin diffamare "to spread abroad by ill report, make a scandal of," from dis-, here probably suggestive of ruination, + fama "a report,

rumour"
