



Coagulation

(Noun)

- the change in the structure of protein (from a liquid form to solid or a thicker liquid) brought about by heat, mechanical action or acids. (food tech).
- the process by which a blood clot is formed. (biology)

ETYMOLOGY: from Latin *coagulat-* 'curdled', from the verb *coagulare* – 'to curdle'.
