






Career of the Month: Fitness Instructor

NHS Step into the NHS Programme

As part of our school careers programme, year 8 pupils were learning about some of the 360 careers available in the NHS. One pupil had an imaginary football accident, and the whole year group then discussed all the different people that might come into contact with that patient. One student commented: 'It was really good, we learnt about jobs we didn't know existed in the NHS.'



The assembly launched the Step into the NHS National Competition. This competition challenges students to research and select an NHS career. Once selected, they research the key responsibilities of the role, along with any qualifications, skills and experience needed. This learning is then used to create a fun and lively job advertisement to appeal to their peers.

National Apprenticeship

National Apprenticeship introduces students into different jobs that they can take through apprenticeships, this includes the 'Future Fridays', highlighting apprenticeships linking to different jobs that may interest them.

A workshop was also included for year 11, so they can get a chance to learn more about jobs and what they would entail, with details on how you can accomplish getting a job that piques your interest.
