(noun)

1. the arrival of a notable person or thing
2. (In Christianity) the first season of the Church year, leading up to Christmas and including the four preceding Sundays.

Etymology: Old English, from Latin *adventus* 'arrival', from *advenire*, from (prefix *ad-* 'to' + (root word) *venire* 'come')

Sentences containing the word 'advent' in different forms:

- many people were excited by the advent of the World Wide Web.
- The advent of the birth of Jesus is recognised in the Christian calendar during the four prior Sundays to Christmas each year.
- With the advent of machinery, human life has become much easier.
