(noun)

- the action of pacifying (making peace with) or placating (calm down) [someone] by acceding to their demands.
- **ETYMOLOGY:** mid-15c., *appesement*, "pacification," from Old French *apaisement* "appeasement, calming," noun of action from *apaisier* "pacify, make peace, placate"
