Year 3

Travelling Back in time

What a term we have had! Year 3 have travelled back in time to Ancient Egypt, and have enjoyed exploring all about the Egyptian way of life, including mummification, gods and Pharaohs, and Howard Carter's ground-breaking discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb.



This was all topped off with our trip to Bolton Museum, where the children's learning came to life and they were able to impress our amazing tour guide, Rob, with all of their knowledge!

This term we have also been busy learning about light and shadows, and how a shadow's size changes depending on how close it is to a light source. In PHSE we have discussed the importance of sharing our feelings and emotions and how these can change depending on the circumstances we find ourselves in. We were so proud of the children for sharing a personal challenge they have faced in the past and what strategies they used in order to overcome the challenge.

Year 4

Horrible Histories

This term, Year 4 have really enjoyed learning about our Topic 'Horrible Histories: The Remix'.

We started our fact gathering on our trip to the Palace Theatre, where we watched 'Horrible Histories: The Terrible Tudors, live on stage'. This was a fantastic opportunity for the children to use this as a springboard to further their understanding and harness their love of History and all things Tudor.

We have created some fantastic portraits of ourselves as Tudor Kings and Queens and become our own architects by designing our own Tudor homes that rival the grandeur of Bramhall Hall!

Year 4 have really enjoyed the opportunity to work on some Tudor dance, looking at various dance styles, from a Tudor Tango to a graceful waltz. We are looking forward to sharing all that we have learnt in our Topic with you at our Year 4 production in January.

Year 6

Theory of Evolution

We have had a very busy term in Year 6! As well as learning about early man and the Theory of Evolution, we also looked at politics, the voting system and Human Rights.

In our assembly, we discussed The Big Bang Theory, Creationism, What Makes Humans Unique? and we even spoke some German!

As part of our transition, we visited The Kingsway School where we danced to 'The Greatest Show', and performed it for our parents and carers at the end of the day. We also designed posters to advertise a circus, which we based on the film The Greatest Showman! We had lots of fun and really enjoyed working with the teachers there.

Back at school, we painted Dreamscapes which we used to inspire a piece of our own descriptive writing

In the run up to the election, we looked at Brexit, parliament and democracy. We also looked at other countries and their political systems. We learned about how voting works in the UK, and how governments are elected, including a hung parliament and how coalitions can be formed.

As part of our democracy lessons, we learned how to code using Scratch, and how Alan Turing cracked the Enigma Code. We used the Caesar Cipher Code to decode messages and to write our own secret messages. We also discussed ways in which Gatley Primary School is democratic:

"Choice is displayed everywhere in our learning environment: this gives us more freedom in what we learn about and choose to do."

"We hold elections for school councils; we vote for the person we want to represent our class. We do this because then the vote is fair and everyone has a say."

"At the end of each term, we have a dojo treat to celebrate our achievements. Our ideas are put forward and we do the one which gets the most votes."

"We get to choose. This has a big impact on us as the choices we make bring responsibility."



Next term, we are looking forward to our next topic, 'Righting our Wrongs', where we will be researching subjects such as plastic pollution and renewable energy.

Governors

From strength to strength

It's the end of another very busy term. The term has seen the opening of the new Upper Key Stage 2 learning area and the outdoor dining area, both of which I know the children love to use. We've also seen the new format of the Star of the Week assembly and I know parents (and children) have enjoyed being able to share this important celebration together.

Everyone associated with the school should be immensely proud of the continued excellent work of the school and it's staff, which enables children to become engaged and independent learners. The data shows the school to be the 82nd best in the whole country (out of nearly 21,000) in terms of results of Reading, Writing and Maths combined at the expected standard at Key Stage 2. This means it is in the top 0.5% of primary schools in the UK. Similarly, the 2019 outcome data identifies that "pupils in the school achieve consistently above national average benchmarks in all subjects". During this term, the school has also commissioned a review of leadership and management with a former Ofsted HMI inspector

who has, through their visit to the school, confirmed that the school continues to be outstanding. A great achievement for the school, not only in terms of results, but in the recognition of the high quality education and curriculum the children receive here.

Finally, I'd like to wish all the children, parents, staff and governors a happy (and restful!) Christmas and New Year.
