












<p>Industry</p> 	<p>A group of businesses that make or sell products/services. For example, hats were made in Stockport.</p>	<p>Stockport The Hat Museum Quarry Bank Mill</p>

<p>Chronology</p> 	<p>The order of historical events and the people involved in them. For example, The Great Fire of London was before the Crimean War.</p>	<p>Timeline Order Earlier/later</p>
<p>Legacy</p> 	<p>The long lasting impact that has been left by people or events.</p>	<p>Importance Remember Impact</p>
<p>Rulers</p> 	<p>People who lead and are in charge. Help to create movement or change.</p>	<p>Monarchs Kings Queens Power</p>
<p>Cause & Effect</p> 	<p>What has caused something to happen and the change it can have after. For example, The houses made from wood are very close together which caused the fire to spread significantly and the effect was that houses are now made from bricks and there fire precautions in place.</p>	<p>Historical Significance Impact Influence Change</p>
<p>Influence</p> 	<p>A person or event that has the power to lead to change.</p>	<p>Change Significance Power Ruler Monarchs</p>
