The Early Years Foundation Stage Framework (EYFS)


Early Years Foundation Stage Framework 2021

The EYFS curriculum is split into *Prime* and *Specific* areas.


- The *Prime Areas* of learning are:

- Literacy;
- Mathematics;
- Understanding the World;
- Expressive Arts and Design.



We offer a Curious curriculum, explored in Collaboration, developing Comprehension and Connectivity enabling Compassion and Creativity for all.













SHARING OUR LEARNING

- Class Dojo is a **whole school reward system**, linked directly to our **behaviour policy** in school.
- Class Dojo enables you to see what we are learning at school, via posts on Class Story.
- Class Dojo along with Parent Mail is used as one of our main sources of communication; it is used to celebrate and disseminate information by both class teachers and the senior leadership team.
- Each week, the children have a **target number of points** to achieve. If they earn all of the required points, they will receive a **reward at the end of the half term** that is **decided by the children**.
