Thankfully, Harold was not as scary as we first thought and he told us all about the red deer living there.

We discovered that we needed to be careful what we volunteered for, as Jessica very nearly had to squeeze the deer pooh to see how fresh it was! Luckily, she was saved from this rather disgusting task and learned how to track the deer instead!

We were also taught how to protect ourselves using shields, how to cook simple flatbread and how to weave using wool. And in the words of Lucy, it was "the best trip ever!"



Year 4

Digestive System

This term, Year 4 have learnt all about the digestive system. We carried out an interesting experiment to help us really understand the different components and how they work. Using our new knowledge, we then went on to create our own songs and poems about the digestive system.

We looked at the key features of what makes music flow, whilst keeping a steady beat and creating our own lyrics. Our poems consisted of figurative language whilst keeping to the theme of the digestive system... and there was plenty of onomatopoeia!



Year 2

Gatley's Got Talent!

This term, Year 2 shared their many talents both inside and outside the classroom. We were delighted to host our production and share with so many people the wonderful array of talents that our children have. From singers, to dancers, sports stars to TV presenters, Year 2 really did display an amazing selection of talent and we know everyone who watched the production was amazed.

The children used their production to further research people who were talented and who inspired them, and many others. We've researched the lives of Michael Jordan, Nelson Mandela, Mother Theresa, Grace Darling and Helen Keller and looked at the attributes that make them so respected and admired.

In English this term, the children have been developing their knowledge and understanding of speech marks



and have been using these in comic books they have been creating. Combined with some fantastic artwork, the children have produced a class comic, containing a range of exciting and inspiring stories in which their characters show resilience and perseverance to overcome a problem.

Year 5

The Final Frontier

What a perfect end to a wonderful year! In our topic this term, 'The Final Frontier', Year 5 have explored the universe, looking at the different planets in our Solar System and describing them using scientific vocabulary.

We also investigated how the moon affects various religious celebrations around the world, including how it determines the timing of Eid, Passover and Wesak.

This term, we were fortunate enough to be visited by Madame Hunt, a French teacher at Kingsway High school, who taught us how to pronounce each of the planets in French. Not only this, but we learnt how to describe the appearance of each planet too!

In English this term, the children have been working hard to write their own suspense story about their arrival on 'Planet Pandora'. Using a range of figurative language devices and dialogue, the children were all able to write a story that captured the reader's interest and left them desperately wanting to read on!

Demonstrating excellent Social Responsibility, Year 5 have all done a wonderful job in their role of 'reading buddies' over the past term. The children have supported the Year 1 children with their reading and phonics, and even tested them with some comprehension questions!

Walking Bus

Over the years, we have had many requests to consider ways in which we can reduce traffic outside school, and also make drop-off and collection more convenient for parents. During a parent and pupil consultation, amongst other options, 73% said they would consider using a 'Walking Bus'.

As such, we are pleased to announce that from September 2019, we are launching our own 'Walking Bus' initiative which will enable children to be dropped off and collected from the pavilion car park.

The entrance to the car park is located on Beech Avenue and is really easy to find. From the school gates, turn right onto Burnside Road, and as the road bends round to the left onto Beech Avenue, turn right. The car park entrance is located directly ahead of you but you will need to cross the footpath to access it, so please drive slowly and carefully as the path can get very busy, especially during school opening and closing times.

The 'bus' will be manned by staff from school, and will meet on the car park every morning at 8:40am. Parents can leave their children with school staff who will then walk them to school using the path which runs alongside the school in time for the start of the school day.



At the end of the day, staff will escort the children back to the car park for parents to collect around 3.40pm.

The route can be seen on the map above, and the walk takes approximately 4-5 minutes.

We know how much you value the safety of all our children, and thank you for your support with this.

Changing Spaces

The beginnings of the new upper key stage 2 learning space are now underway. Our Year 4 and 5 Creative Council representatives have led on designing and remodeling this space.

This included a visit and tour of the MMU Birley Building to give inspiration to what a creative learning space can look like. Following this, the children have made decisions around which key skills should be profiled in this space. On deciding that ICT/ research and reflection should be the skills that are developed within this space, the children have designed what should be included in these areas and have been most ambitious with what this space will become.

Power of Parent Voice


During this academic year, our parent voice group have been an instrumental part in shaping and influencing school changes.

Parent Voice is designed as a forum for parents to raise any concerns or questions regarding school changes but also as a means to help the school address any questions they are seeking to explore. As a result of this group, we are introducing a large number of initiatives next academic year which will seek to improve provision for our current pupils.

One such concern was the traffic outside the front of school. As a result of the concern, the school has amended some support staff's timetabling to incorporate the running of a 'Walking Bus'. Parents will be encouraged to drop off pupils at the Sports Pavilion Car Park (off Beech Road) from 8.30am.

The Walking Bus will set off at 8.40am and will aim to arrive in school for an 8.50am start to the school day. Equally, the walking bus will set off from school at 3.30pm and will aim to arrive back to the car park for 3.40pm. Our Young Gatley Village Partnership are also designing invitations – so look out for these during our first week back! We hope the initiative will be a huge success and will seek to improve the provision for our pupils at the beginning and end of the school day.
