




<p>Influence</p> 	<p>The influence that the world's economic processes and trade links have on the environment of an individual nation.</p>	<p>Influence, Environment, Resources, Economy, Trade, Population</p>
<p>Appreciation</p> 	<p>The recognition of the power and influence of individual countries and areas across the world.</p>	<p>Influence, Environment, Resources, Economy, Trade, Population</p>
<p>Culture</p> 	<p>Understanding of own cultural identity and how cultures develop and change over time.</p>	<p>Identity Languages Belief Shared values</p>
