












<p>Appreciation</p> 	<p>Appreciation of the significant historical figures and events that have shaped our local society, understanding that our local area is a product of its history.</p>	<p>Significance Legacy</p>
<p>Industry</p> 	<p>Economic activity concerned with the processing of raw materials and manufacture of goods in factories and the impact on the local area.</p>	<p>Economy Culture</p>
<p>Significance</p> 	<p>Historical significance involves judging why a particular person or event is remembered and relevant to the present day and our locality.</p>	<p>Windrush, Generation, World War</p>

<p>Chronology</p> 	<p>Chronology means 'the study of time' and is concerned with the time order in which events in history have taken place whilst making connections between events and periods of time.</p>	<p>Timeline CE/BCE Order Events</p>
<p>Legacy</p> 	<p>Evaluating the long term impacts of a significant person, event or artefact in history, considering both positive and negative legacies.</p>	<p>Impact Significance</p>
<p>Rulers</p> 	<p>Rulers are those who lead a country, civilisation or empire and the effectiveness of their control. For example a monarch (King or Queen), an emperor or a political ruler such as a Prime Minister or President.</p>	<p>Monarch Government Leader Politicians Countries Power World War Democracy Voting Protest</p>
<p>Cause & Effect</p> 	<p>Analyse the factors which lead to a significant event in history and the resulting impact of these events, making comparisons across different periods of history.</p>	<p>Rise and fall Civilisations Impact Significance</p>

<p>Influence</p> 	<p>How different world civilisations have impacted upon one on another and how events are interconnected.</p>	<p>Civilisations Legacy Events</p>
<p>Structures</p> 	<p>The societal and hierarchical organisation of a civilisation or empire and the way in which these structures have shifted and changed over time.</p>	<p>Hierarchy Civilisations Formation Roles Allies Axis</p>
<p>Rise & Collapse</p> 	<p>How civilisations and empires expand and grow, and then ultimately fall and lose their power.</p>	<p>Achievement Power War and conflict</p>
<p>Power</p> 	<p>How power shifts and changes over time due to invasion, uprisings and war.</p>	<p>Achievement Allies Axis</p>
