We have **some** capacity available for children to attend Nursery for additional sessions, as per the government funded 30 hours child care for families that qualify for this funding (those with a code). Please note, the school has a limit on the number of Nursery places that can be offered, and those places will be allocated to children in priority categories (in addition to the usual admission criteria adopted by the Local Authority). Please submit your request for additional hours in writing to the school office by Midday 11<sup>th</sup> July, any additional hours allocated will be communicated to you in writing.

The categories are as follows:

- Child lives in catchment of school, both parents work between the hours of 8:45am 3:30pm and the child has a sibling in the school.


If you are unsuccessful in securing the hours you **require** for your child, the school are able to provide information of other childcare providers within the area.

### Characteristics of Effective Learning

Characteristics of Effective Learning (CoEL) advocate that in planning and guiding children's activities, practitioners must reflect on the different ways that children learn, and then reflect these in their practice. A child's individual learning characteristic will determine the way they respond to both the teaching and learning taking place in the environment.

#### **Playing and exploring – engagement**

Finding out and exploring
Playing with what they know
Being willing to 'have a go'

#### **Active learning – motivation**

Being involved and concentrating Keeping trying Enjoying achieving what they set out to do

#### **Creating and thinking critically – thinking**

Having their own ideas
Making links
Choosing ways to do things

Underpinning the CoEL is the understanding that during their earliest years, children form attitudes about learning that will last a lifetime. Children who receive the right sort of support and encouragement during these years will be creative, and adventurous learners throughout their lives.

## The Early Years Foundation Stage Framework (EYFS) sets out the learning and development stages for children as they grow from birth to five years.

Children develop more rapidly during the first five years of their lives than at any other time. For those working in the early years, the Early Years Foundation Stage framework outlines what practitioners need to do to support your child.

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) has its own stand-alone curriculum for Pre-School and Reception children in primary settings. From September 2021 the EYFS curriculum is changing for all settings in England

#### **Early Years Foundation Stage Framework 2021**

The EYFS curriculum is split into *Prime* and *Specific* areas. The prime areas are important because they lay the foundations for children's success in all other areas of learning and of life. The specific areas provide the range of experiences and opportunities for children to broaden their knowledge and skills:

The **Prime Areas** of learning are:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development;

Communication and Language;

Physical Development.

The **Specific Areas** of learning are:

Literacy;

Mathematics;

Understanding the World;

Expressive Arts and Design.

At the end of the Reception year, pupils are benchmarked against the Early Learning Goals for each area. Attainment is described as either: **emerging** (working below the expected level) or **expected** (working at the expected level) and these are reported to parents in the end-of-vear written report.

#### **Key Changes to the EYFS Framework 2021**

- The 7 areas of learning and development will remain the same, however, they have been updated to be clearer and more specific.
- There will be a new focus on early language and extending vocabulary through conversations and discussions, encouraging children to focus on speaking in full sentences.
- There will be a focus on developing good oral health.
- There will be a focus on self-regulation; children are expected to know right from wrong and be able to explain the reasons for rules.
- There will be an emphasis on physical exercise and keeping safe.
- There will be more focus on preparation for writing.
- There will be a comprehension and word reading strand.
- In Maths there will be a focus on depth of understanding and numerical patterns; these changes fit with the Maths Mastery Principles which the government recommend.

#### Our curriculum at Gatley Primary is coconstructed between children and staff.

We lay particular emphasis on teaching a wide range of skills to prepare children for each transitional phase, including secondary education and their future role in society. Woven through our innovative and creative approach to learning, children receive focused teaching in our core skills.






### SHARING OUR LEARNING

- Class Dojo is a **whole school reward system**, linked directly to our **behaviour policy** in school.
- Class Dojo enables you to see what we are learning at school, via posts on Class Story.
- Class Dojo along with Parent Mail is used as one of our main sources of communication; it is used to celebrate and disseminate information by both class teachers and the senior leadership team.
- Each week, the children have a **target number of points** to achieve. If they earn all of the required points, they will receive a **reward at the end of the half term** that is **decided by the children**.
