POLITICS enthusiast Hasan Patel has completed a remarkable year by winning a £76,000 scholarship to Eton College, the school attended by Princes William and Harry.

Hasan will rub shoulders with the elite when he begins studying at the world-famous Berkshire school next September.

It comes after he became the youngest-ever speaker at a major political party conference when he addressed Labour Party delegates in August.

Aged just 15, he was a year younger than the previous youngest speaker and former Conservative party leader, William Hague.

Hasan won his Eton place after coming through a gruelling three-day assessment at the school, which included three entrance exams, seven interviews and a public debate.
