




British Values at Glenfield Infant School





Democracy - Having a voice:

We have 'happiness heroes' as part of our SCARF and My Happy Mind Programme, where children vote for their peers and feel that their voice is heard. We often conduct class votes for stories, rewards, games. We also value talk partners to give children opportunity to generate ideas for various subjects. During circle times, children listen to others' ideas and take turns expressing their own. Sharing responsibilities and listening to classmates.

SCARF helps by:

- Status - Children that they are listened to
- Autonomy - Children make simple choices
 - Fairness -Everyone gets a turn



Rule of Law (Rules Keep Us Safe)

At Glenfield, we have School Rules and Values: Ready, Respectful, Safe. We regularly explain that rules keep us safe, help us to learn and be kind and fair and get along with others. Following rules consistently helps children persevere safely. Understanding classroom expectations supports steady progress.

Children learn why rules are important.

SCARF helps by:

- Certainty - Clear routines help children feel safe
- Fairness - Rules are the same for everyone
- Status - Praise for following rules



Individual Liberty (Making Choices)

Children learn they can make choices safely. At Glenfield, children are encouraged to make safe choices and try new things. Children have the freedom to keep trying and contribute their ideas. Children make choices about learning and play.

SCARF helps by:

- Autonomy - Feeling confident to explore independently.
 - Status - Feeling proud of their choices
 - Certainty - Adults help keep choices safe



Mutual Respect and Tolerance (Being Kind)

Children learn to be kind and respect differences.

As one of our values is Respect, we encourage the children to demonstrate this by listening to their peers and class teacher. Resilient children respect others' space and efforts. Working together and valuing each other's ideas.

SCARF helps by:

- Relatedness - Feeling they belong
- Fairness - Everyone is included
- Status - Celebrating what makes us special
